The owners of the Atkins Park taverns amp up the swank factor at their newest neighborhood pub, a two-level Westside looker sporting a subterranean bocce court, billiards tables, and handsome dartboards. Ormsby's is best appreciated as a warm-spirited hangout with a respectable list of craft beers. Though it has quickly become a popular lunch destination, and though the menu reads ambitiously for a watering hole, this place isn't about the food. Sandwiches—pastrami and Swiss, a classic or vegetarian club, grilled cheese with bacon and tomato—fill the stomach without much zing on the taste buds. Fries accompanied by varied dipping sauces draw comparisons to those at Leon's Full Service in Decatur, but Ormsby's spuds need more crispness, and the sauces, particularly an oddly sweet lemon aioli, need tinkering. (The "house-made cheese whiz" is trashy fun, though.) There's no sign outside Ormsby's, by the way: Walk to the far right of the White Provision complex and look for the portico with the wooden door emblazoned with a black curlicue "O." \$ —B.A.



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
