

Yeah Burger opens in Atlanta

Shaun Doty is the latest Atlanta chef to open a burger joint. His Yeah Burger opened on June 10, 2010 in a renovated building on the Westside. The spot is marked with bright Yeah Burger signs and signature graphics. Inside, customers pick up menus at the entrance before standing in line to order at the counter. Burgers atop waxed paper are delivered to each diner on retro metal trays.

Customers build their own burgers from a selection of patties (choices include Georgia-raised beef, bison, turkey, veggie or a chicken breast), buns and toppings, ranging from lettuce and tomatoes to pimento cheese and fried eggs. Side items include crispy onion rings and shoestring fries. A variety of sauces, like bacon jam and roasted garlic aioli, complement both burgers and fries.

Signature cocktails and beer and wine are served, in addition to fountain Coca-Cola soft drinks and bottled sodas. Yeah Burger also offers organic ice cream, which is used to make milkshakes, floats and concretes, which are blended treats made with one of 10 mix-ins.

The restaurant's patio, which seats 40, is almost as big as the dining room, which has space for 55 people. A 17-seat counter faces the open kitchen.—*Rachael Mason, Metromix*
