We love that the price range is über-wide: The colorful showroom features stationery, furniture and just about everything in between.

We really dig: pottery collections, lacquered domino sets, burl-wood Bond furniture

Hot for summer: "We think this summer should be about throwing out your BlackBerry and going to pick some actual blackberries," Adler says.

Seagrass flooring and wainscoting on the walls make this expansive showroom feel like the home of that one friend who always manages to look effortlessly chic. A near-monochromatic palette punctuated by pops of color, reminiscent of designer Kelly Hoppen's style, comprises rich textures and luxe touches that can be best described as "refined organic." The main room of furniture (some antique) and accessories, brimming with seemingly one-of-a-kind *objets d'art*, is adjacent to an extensive lighting gallery.

We really dig: agate bookends, vintage ethnic textiles, stacks of design books

Hot for summer: "Great products this season include fun and colorful pillows in orange and turquoise, new candles from Astier de Villate, summer scents from Diptyque, white slip-covered furniture and jute rugs with linen trim," owner Courtney Tilinski says.

This shrine to modern design celebrates the aesthetic in all its forms: Arne Jacobsen's 1958 Swan Chair, delightful Mooi suspension lamps and Italian Poliform case goods. Head to the back for a dizzying selection of accessories and gift items by the likes of Alessi, Normann Copenhagen and Stelton. Then check the website for an even more extensive inventory, as well as a design forum by owners Roy Otwell and Doug Henderson.

We really dig: Areaware's Bank in the Form of a Pig, Philippe Starck's Louis Ghost Armchair, Limited Edition rugs

Hot for summer: "People are becoming more optimistic, and that's being reflected in more color and a sense of fun," Otwell says. "But that's being tempered by a desire for value." Some of the shop's newest products that reflect this trend include iPad covers by Graf & Lantz and Alessi watches.

Plus, as its French moniker implies, this is a full design house, offering a multitude of services from architectural planning and wall treatments to upholstery and lighting design.

We really dig: CHC artwork, Italamp lighting, anything by Christopher Guy

Hot for summer: “We just got in a shipment of gorgeous pillows in various textures and sizes and colors—we at Maison Atlanta love color,” the store's Crawford Bray says. “We had a special wall built to hold them all and show them in their glory!”

Reclaimed, recycled or repurposed woods compose much of the furniture you'll see here—and it's all gorgeous. Grain patterns and natural variations make tables, sideboards and benches into eye-catching pieces of sculpture; they share floor space at this organic contemporary showroom with clean-lined upholstered pieces (also sustainably made) and multi-culti accents.

Piles of old *Rolling Stone* and *National Geographic* mags; a turntable playing vinyls; and a buffet serving up yellow gumballs, lemonheads and lollipops lend a homey, welcoming warmth.

We really dig: the shaggy Giramundo Swivel Chair, papier-mâché sculptures from the BRANDAID Project, Environment by Heather Heron Collection bags
